Appointment Information:

Medical Screenings for **Family Members** traveling outside the continental United States (OCONUS) or to remote locations are done by appointment only. **To prevent travel delays, family member screening appointments should be scheduled upon receipt of appropriate military OCONUS/remote travel screening forms**

- If **ARMY**, the service member should obtain a Family Member Deployment Screening Sheet, DA Form 5888. Section 8 of DA Form 5888 must be completed and signed by the Military Personnel Section and brought to the screening appointment.
- If **AIR FORCE**, the service member should obtain a Request for Family Member's Medical and Education Clearance for Travel, AF form 1466 and DD Form 2972 Special Education/Early Intervention Summary (one from for each school age child). In addition, each family member age 2 and older must have an AF Form 1466D Dental Health Summary
- If **NAVY or MARINE CORPS**, service member must obtain a NAVMED 1300/1, Medical, Dental and Educational Suitability Screening for Service and Family Members (one for each family member).

Bring all family member medical and immunization records to appointment. Bring a copy of the current Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or Individualized Family Services Plan (IFSP) for any family members receiving special education/early intervention services.

Ensure family members have current and complete medical information. All family members should have documentation of up to date immunizations. Infants must have up to date well-baby visit documented in the record. Children 3 - 17 years and adults must have documentation of a physical exam (adult women must also have a female well woman exam) within one year. Any outstanding tests or consultations orders by the physician must be completed prior to the final medical clearance (i.e., if the doctor ordered a cardiology consultation, it must be completed and the results documented in the family member's medical record).

Family members who have been receiving medical care from a civilian physician must present a copy of those medical records at the time of the family appointment.

Bring all family members six (6) years of age and younger to the appointment.

Travel Clinic (301) 677-8435) appointments may be needed if you anticipate that your family members may need immunizations to meet a specific country requirement. Note special immunizations and prophylaxes are not addressed in detail during the family member screening appointment.
